

# Bubbly Glass Tealight Holder

## Supplies:

Wide-Mouth Wine Glass or glass of your choice  
Large (or assorted sized) Confetti (ie. Snowflakes)  
Poinsettia Flower or small snowman figure  
Glass Tealight Holder  
Gel Candle Wax  
Tealight  
Holly berry or other Winter Picks  
3/8" – 3 pieces of Ribbon (can be different colors (around 12" long)  
Glue, Glue Gun  
Popsicle stick  
Pot (one that you will use only for candles)  
Candle thermometer



## Directions:

Melt gel candle wax on low heat for 5 to 10 minutes or until the gel has liquefied. For more bubbles, pour at lower temperature. For less bubbles pour at higher temperature. DO NOT EXCEED 260°. Remove poinsettia flower from stem and glue leaves to the bottom on the flower. Place flower into the bottom on wine glass. OR if you are using a snowflake/snowman figure add to the bottom. Slowly add hot gel wax into glass leaving room at top for tea light (around 2"). Using a wooden popsicle stick to adjust flower/figure to the location you want. Add your snowflakes and adjust flakes using your popsicle stick. While you wait for the gel to cool and harden, make you bow by taking the three pieces of ribbon and tying them together in the middle with a knot, then make a bow (like your tying your shoe). Arrange the bow so that they look good. Take your holly berry or other pick and arrange so that it covers the stem of the wine glass and glue into place. Now add your bow to the front of your candle at the stem. You candle should be hard now, place the glass tealight holder on top of the gel wax and add more hot wax until the wine glass is full (around the holder – make sure you do not get wax in the holder). Add your tealight when gel has completely harden/cooled.

Light your candle and enjoy!! P.S. The best part is when the tealight burns out just add a new one!
